

ACME Course

The ACME course has been designed to stimulate and engage the experienced physician practising Emergency Medicine who wishes to consolidate their skills and knowledge and be challenged in a supportive environment. The ACME course is facilitated by highly experienced emergency physicians. Because the emphasis is on learning and sharing information, there is no formal assessment of participants.

Core Modules

The ACME course is built around five core modules:

- Human Factors
- Cardiovascular instability
- Airway and Respiratory Emergencies
- Shock and Complex Emergencies
- Death Dying and Grief

Additional Modules

As well as the core modules, the ACME course has a range of additional modules including:

- Altered conscious state
- Toxicology
- Behavioural Emergencies

Designed by ACEM Fellows, the ACME course utilizes high fidelity simulation in order to allow participants to actually put into practice what is learnt during the course.

The course is available to College of Emergency Medicine Fellows and trainees in their final two years of training (with a letter of support from their DEMENT)

MOPS Points

Up to 50 points may be allocated per course comprising

- 30 points (Accredited Workshops)
- Up to 20 points for procedural skills (depending on the optional module)
